Basics

To be eligible to take the NYPD Sergeants Promotional Exam, you need to have three (3) years in rank as a Police Officer by the day of the exam. If you do not have the three (3) years in rank, you will not be allowed to take the exam. In addition to having three (3) years in rank as a Police Officer, if you pass the exam (attain a 70% or higher and they reach your list number), you will need five (5) years in rank as a Police Officer to be eligible for promotion. The last requirement is that you have attained 64 college credits from an accredited college/university. Since you require college credits to be hired, this should not be an issue for the majority of Police Officers.



Preparation

To be successful at a civil service promotional exam in the NYPD, it requires approximately 6 months of preparation. Because of the volume of material which you are required to know, it will not be an easy endeavor. Nothing in life worth achieving is usually easy.

The Exam

The Sergeant Promotional Exam consists of a multiple choice question exam. To pass the exam you need to attain a score of at least a seventy percent (70%) to earn a place on the your promotional exam list. The exam consists of seven (7) areas of knowledge:
